Duties and Responsibilities of a Guardian

1. The Guardian is legally responsible to administer funds received from The Manitoba Public Insurance Corporation on behalf of a minor. These funds remain the property of the minor.
2. The Guardian must be prepared at any time to give an accounting to the minor, the Public Guardian and Trustee, or to the Court of Queen's Bench with respect to the administration of the funds, and to show that the funds were dealt with in the minor's best interest.
3. Any surplus of income over expenses must be invested in secure deposits (bank accounts, safe securities, or savings bonds) so that no unnecessary risks are taken with the minor's money and nothing is done to deplete the capital value of the victim's assets, unless to do so can be clearly shown to be in the victim's best interest.
4. The Guardian will remain responsible for the administration of the funds until the minor reaches the age of majority; or until a court orders otherwise.
5. The Guardian is legally responsible for compliance with the Subrogation Indemnity Agreement.

Note on The Public Guardian and Trustee:

The Public Guardian and Trustee's office is appointed by law as the official guardian of all minors and other persons who are "legally disabled". It is the Public Guardian and Trustee's responsibility to ensure that the best interests of such persons are being served by those who are acting on their behalf, and the trustee has the power to carry out this responsibility.
